#### **CROSSLINKS TELEPHONE BEFRIENDING SERVICE – VOLUNTEERS:**

Crosslinks Befriending service is looking for more volunteers to supplement our team. We currently have a number of pending clients who await someone to offer telephone befriending.

Our clients tend to be people of all ages who are usually lonely because of their personal circumstances and are requiring social inter-action.

Volunteers are ideally good listeners, able to offer a few minutes a week or fortnightly to offer friendship and a connection to the outside world for people who are often housebound or isolated. Referrals come from various agencies in Worcestershire.

<u>THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK – Psalm 85 v. 8 "Let me hear what God the Lord will speak, for he will speak</u> peace to his people, to his faithful, to those who turn to him in their hearts."

**COMMENT:** These words are from the psalm selected for today (8<sup>th</sup>). The gospel reading is Luke 3 verses 1 – 6, which describes John Baptist's ministry to the people of the Jordan area, offering a baptism of repentance, and calling his hearers to "prepare the way of the Lord".

I suppose Advent is about that spiritual journey we are called upon to make yearly, as we prepare to celebrate once more the wonder of God's indescribable gift of his Son, fulfilling John's words "and all flesh shall see the salvation of God".

We know that God revealed himself as never before through the person of Jesus, and in his teachings Christ makes known the will and purpose, and the nature of God. He said to his followers "If you have seen me you have seen the Father – I and my Father are one". So it behoves us as followers of Christ to "hear what the Lord God will speak, for he will speak peace, to those who turn to him in their hearts".

As we think of the remarkable ministry of John, it is to prepare the hearts and minds of the people for the coming of the One who will be Saviour, Messiah, Redeemer and Friend.

During Advent may we draw ever nearer to God, who in Christ became one of us, Emmanuel- God with us. Let us rejoice at the unspeakable gift of the Babe of Bethlehem, who lived as do we, who died for our salvation, and rose again to give us the hope of eternal life. Advent is a special period, in which we can "put Christ back into Christmas". Every blessing, *John*.
