THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK – Hymn StF No. 429 – part

Your forgiveness lifts our burdens, setting heart and spirit free
to fulfil our true potential, all that we were meant to be.
For you teach a way of wisdom we may clearly understand,
walking with the God of mercy step by step, and hand in hand

COMMENT:

This pair of verses from Martin Leckebush, a contemporary hymn writer, is from a hymn I do not recall ever singing. It is good, I think to spend time contemplating some of the gems contained within our hymnbook.

Like many things, we take the forgiveness we receive from a compassionate God for granted. Here we are reminded of the relief from that sense of guilt before God for "sins" of commission – or omission. When we feel ourselves "right with God" because of our assurance of forgiveness, it does indeed set 'heart and spirit free'.

We are then able to be the kind of person God wants us to be, unshackled from the habits or lifestyle that would hinder our being able to fulfil our potential as effective servants of our Lord Jesus, who gave his all in order to buy us our freedom from all that would displease God – indeed to give us new life, a transformed, purposeful, full life.

God's 'wisdom', i.e. knowing the lifestyle we should live, with God at the centre is not difficult to 'understand' - all that we have to do is to trust our Lord, and walk in his way, with our hand in God's.

If we feel that we are not disciples because of the freedom forgiveness offers us, then we may come to God instead because we are burdened with anxiety, about the many worries that afflict us. Then our reason for discipleship may be that we find peace and rest, and serenity in our relationship with our Lord and Saviour, who calls to us "Come to me all who are burdened and I will give you rest." The important thing, I believe, is to ensure we have that relationship with God. Every blessing, *John*.
